### Symposium/ Session Abstract

- Experiences with groups around the world suggest that members and their communities desire opportunities promised by group participation. Group membership appears central to human experience and the promotion of social justice. However, while the power of groups is indisputable, people who work with diverse groups rarely have the opportunity to talk with each other about the connections, challenges, joys and demands they encounter.
- We have proposed this Special Interest Group session to draw World
  Conference attendees who are organizers, facilitators and/or members of
  groups across disciplines. We will discuss the experiences of participants,
  and if appropriate, develop preliminary ideas for ongoing networking and
  promoting group interventions and activities to build sustainable societies.
- Based on our experiences with past special interest groups, including in Adelaide (2004 World Congress), Munich (2006 World Congress), Bonn (2011 United Nations DPI/NGO Conference), and Stockholm (2012 World Conference), these sessions provide a less formal venue for participants to focus on their work and support each other as they share struggles and accomplishments.
